Equipment "Diagnostic equipment" means equipment used to record 14 physiological information while a person goes about normal daily living or while asleep in order 15 to document a disease process. Early pregnancy tests (EPTs), thermometers, glucose meters, and 16 cholesterol equipment are not included as diagnostic equipment. Drug\_"Drug\_regimen\_review" review or drug\_"drug\_use review. A review" means a review of a 17 (4)18 patient's record by a licensed pharmacist that involves interpretation and evaluation of the drug 19 therapy and other pharmaceutical care services to achieve intended medication outcomes and 20 minimize negative effects of drug therapy. 21 (5) Employee. A "Employee" means a person who is or would be considered an employee under the 22 North Carolina Workers' Compensation Act. This definition applies to locations locations, both 23 within and outside of this State State, holding pharmacy or device and medical equipment permits 24 and without regard to the number of persons employed by the permit holder. 25 (6)Graduate-<u>"Graduate</u> of an approved school of <u>or</u> college of <del>pharmacy. A pharmacy" means a</del> 26 person who has received an undergraduate professional degree in pharmacy from an approved 27 school or college of pharmacy. 28 (7)Health-<u>"Health</u> Care Facility. One Facility" means one of the following organizations whose 29 primary purpose is to provide a physical environment for patients to obtain health care services: 30 (a) a hospital; 31 (b) a long-term care facility; 32 a mental health facility; (c) 33 (d) a drug abuse treatment center; 34 (e) an assisted living facility; 35 (f) an ambulatory surgical center; 36 (g) a penal institution; or 37 a hospice. (h)

1	(8)	Health- <u>"Health</u> Care Facility Pharmacy. A Pharmacy" means a pharmacy permitted by the Board
2		that provides services to patients of a Health Care Facility.
3	(9)	Internet pharmacy "Internet pharmacy" means:
4		(a) A pharmacy that maintains an Internet web site for the purpose of selling or distributing
5		prescription drugs; or
6		(b) A pharmacy that uses the Internet, either itself, or through agreement with a third party,
7		to communicate with or obtain information from patients; uses such communication or
8		information, in whole or in part, to solicit, fill or refill prescriptions; or otherwise uses
9		such communication or information, in whole or in part, to engage in the practice of
10		pharmacy.
11		Notwithstanding Sub-items (a) and (b) above, a pharmacy shall not be deemed an Internet
12		pharmacy if it maintains each Internet web site for the following purposes only:
13		(i) To post advertisements that do not attempt to facilitate, directly or through
14		agreement with a third party, an actual transaction involving a prescription drug;
15		(ii) To allow a patient to communicate a request for a refill of a valid prescription
16		originally filled by the pharmacy that maintains the Internet web site;
17		(iii) To allow a customer to research drug interactions and clinical pharmacology
18		information; or
19		(iv) To allow a patient to send an electronic mail message to a pharmacist licensed in
20		North Carolina.
21	(10)	Medication Order. An <u>"Medication Order" means an</u> order for a drug, device, or medical
22		equipment for a patient from a person authorized by law to prescribe them.
23	(11)	Mobility equipment. Devices "Mobility equipment" means devices that aid a person in self-
24		movement other than walking, including manual or power wheelchairs and scooters.
25	(12)	North- <u>"North</u> Carolina <u>resident" resident</u> or resident- <u>"resident-</u> of North <mark>Carolina. Any Carolina"</mark>
26		<u>includes not just any</u> patient who is <del>a temporary or permanent resident of</del> <u>domiciled in</u> the State of
27		North Carolina or Carolina, but also any patient who is present in the State of North Carolina at
28		the time a drug, device, or medical equipment is dispensed to that person.
29	(13)	Oxygen_"Oxygen_and respiratory care equipment. Equipment equipment" means equipment_or
30		devices used to administer oxygen or other legend drugs, maintain viable airways, or monitor
31		cardio-respiratory conditions or events, including the following:
32		(a) compressed medical gases;
33		(b) oxygen concentrators;
34		(c) liquid oxygen;
35		(d) nebulizers;
36		(e) compressors;
37		(f) aerosol therapy devices;

1		(g) portable suction machines;
2		(h) nasal continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) machines;
3		(i) Bi-phasic positive pressure devices (BiPAP);
4		(j) infant monitors, such as apnea monitors and cardio-respiratory monitors;
5		(k) positive and negative pressure mechanical ventilators; and
6		(l) pulse oximeters.
7	(14)	Patient <u>"Patient</u> medication profile," "patient profile," profile, patient profile, or pharmacy profile.
8		A <u>"pharmacy profile" means a list</u> of all medications prescribed for or dispensed to a patient.
9	(15)	Pharmacist Manager. The <u>"Pharmacist-Manager" means the</u> person who accepts responsibility for
10		the operation of a pharmacy in conformance with all statutes and rules pertinent to the practice of
11		pharmacy and distribution of drugs by signing the permit application, its renewal, or addenda
12		thereto.
13	(16)	Pharmacy Intern. Any <u>"Pharmacy Intern" means any</u> person who is registered with the Board
14		under the internship program of the Board to acquire pharmacy experience or enrolled in approved
15		academic internship programs. A pharmacy intern working under a pharmacist preceptor or
16		supervising pharmacist may, while under supervision, perform all acts constituting the practice of
17		pharmacy.
18	(17)	Rehabilitation- <u>"Rehabilitation</u> environmental control equipment. Equipment-Equipment" means
19		equipment or devices that permit a person with disabilities to control his or her immediate
20		surroundings.
21	(18)	<del>Undergraduate <u>"Undergraduate</u> p</del> rofessional degree in <del>pharmacy. A pharmacy" means a</del> Bachelor
22		of Science in Pharmacy or a Doctor of Pharmacy degree.
