Virginia,

Thanks for your response. I have a follow up, and I will copy/paste from the change request document, with my follow up in bold below:

In (b), line 21, what do you mean by "Reports shall be made in alignment with..."? Are you requiring something other than compliance with the reporting requirements in the US DHHS document you incorporate by reference?

This language is intended to require reports that align with the requirements of the federal HHS document.

I'm sorry, but this does not answer my question. I asked, because the phrase "made in alignment with" is somewhat unusual, and is different from what I'd expect if you were just requiring compliance with the US DHHS document's requirements. Frankly, to me "alignment" connotes a general but relaxed compliance, which introduces a lack of clarity as to what you're actually requiring (i.e. when compliance is strictly necessary, when a departure from the document's requirements may be made, etc). Please clarify what this language means.
