204.3.5 Design professional seal required. Where the General Statutes, North Carolina Board of Architecture and Registered Interior Designers, or the North Carolina Board of Examiners for Engineers and Land Surveyors require, no permit shall be issued unless the construction documents (drawings and specifications), (drawings and specifications) bear the North Carolina seal of a registered design professional registered design professional. Construction documents (or partnership) with whom the registered design professional is affiliated. Questions concerning this section should be directed to the North Carolina Board of Architecture and Registered Interior Designers or the North Carolina Board of Examiners for Engineers and Land Surveyors.

Exceptions: For permitting purposes, the seal of a registered design professional is not required when the building, structure or project involved is in one of the categories listed below, unless otherwise required pursuant to the provisions of the General Statutes or the technical codes:

- 1. A family residence, up to eight units attached with grade level exit, which is not a part of or physically connected with any other buildings or residential units;
- 2. A building upon any farm that is for the use of any farmer, unless the building is of such nature and intended for such use as to substantially involve the health or safety of the public;
- 3. An institutional or commercial building if it does not have a total cost of construction exceeding \$90,000;
- 4. An institutional or commercial building if the total building area does not exceed 2,500 square feet (2.32 m2) in gross floor area;
- 5. Alteration, remodeling or renovation of an existing building that is exempt under this section, or alteration, remodeling or renovation of an existing building or building site that does not alter or affect the structural system of the building; change the building's access or exit pattern; or change the live or dead load on the building's structural system. This subdivision shall not limit or change any other exemptions to this chapter or to the practice of engineering under Chapter 89C of the General Statutes.
- 6. The preparation and use of details and shop drawings, assembly or erection drawings, or graphic descriptions utilized to detail or illustrate a portion of the work required to construct the project in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared or to be prepared under the requirements or exemptions of this chapter.
- 7. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent any individual from making plans or data for buildings for himself or herself. This exemption does not apply to plans for places of religious worship.

R101.2 Scope. The provisions of the *International Residential Code for One- and Two-family Dwellings* shall apply to the construction, *alteration*, movement, enlargement, replacement, repair repair, equipment, use and occupancy, location, removal removal, and demolition of detached one- and two-family dwellings dwellings and townhouse townhouses not more than three stories above grade plane in height with a separate means of egress, egress and their accessory structures not more than three stories above grade plane in height. Construction documents (construction documents) shall include the name and address of the business entity (individual, corporation corporation, or partnership) with whom the registered design professional is affiliated. Questions concerning this section should be directed to the North Carolina Board of Architecture and Registered Interior Designers or the North Carolina Board of Examiners for Engineers and Land Surveyors.

Exceptions: For permitting purposes, the seal of a registered design professional is not required when the building, structure or project involved is in one of the categories listed below, unless otherwise required pursuant to the provisions of the General Statutes or the technical codes:

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- 5. Alteration, remodeling or renovation of an existing building that is exempt under this section, or alteration, remodeling or renovation of an existing building or building site that does not alter or affect the structural system of the building; change the building's access or exit pattern; or change the live or dead load on the building's structural system. This subdivision shall not limit or change any other exemptions to this chapter or to the practice of engineering under Chapter 89C of the General Statutes.
- 6. The preparation and use of details and shop drawings, assembly or erection drawings, or graphic descriptions utilized to detail or illustrate a portion of the work required to construct the project in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared or to be prepared under the requirements or exemptions of this chapter.
- 7. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent any individual from making plans or data for buildings for himself or herself. This exemption does not apply to plans for places of religious worship.

Thanks for the quick turnaround on these. One major thing, and a few minor quibbles. First, the major question — it escaped my attention on the first review that all the changes in your original filing are highlighted. Were these all made after publication? It doesn't look that way from your notice of text, but I wanted to be sure. For future reference, you only need to highlight changes made to the text after you published. If you wouldn't mind, please remove the highlighting from everything except what you changed post-publication (i.e. in response to public comment or to these requests for changes).

Admin Code 204.3.5

• The first instance of "construction documents" wasn't italicized, please correct.

Residential Code R101.2 and R202

• This seems petty, but when we add or delete punctuation, the way to format it is to strikethrough the word preceding as well as the punctuation, and then reinsert the word. Here, where you removed the comma after "egress" it should be formatted like so:

separate means of egress, egress and their accessory structures

• Similarly, when you added a comma after "removal":

location, removal removal, and demolition of detached one- and two-family dwellings

 Please check all your rules for this, because I think there were other instances where this needed to be fixed.

Residential Code R101.2 and Table R302.1...

I'm just copying from the change requests here as I think it's more clear this way. My new comments in blue:

What does "assumed property lines" mean? Traditional townhouses are separated by property lines and are considered two separate lots. An assumed property lines apply to multiple townhouses on a single lot. No changes were made to the proposed rule.

I understand the concept now, but is there a way to make this clearer for your regulated public? How would one know where the "assumed property lines" are if they're not recorded as property lines?

In both the Fire Code and Building Code, 903.2.8 Group R, 4.1, and what are "remote unimpeded exits"? Is this defined? If so, italicize for consistency. Remote unimpeded exits is not a defined term. Open air camp cabins would require an automatic sprinkler system if two remote unimpeded exits are not provided. No changes were made to the proposed rule.

I still don't see a definition of the term "remote unimpeded exits." I understand what an <u>unimpeded</u> exit is, I just don't understand what a <u>remote</u> exit is. Can you explain?
