Lines 5-6,(a) (1): As written, the rule <u>requires</u> the Board to dispense funds after Board Committees recommend funding. Is that the Board's intention? Does it need to pass each committee or only the committee(s) assigned? How are requests assigned to committees?

Lines 5-6,(a) (1): Is Subparagraph (1) necessary pursuant to G.S. 150B-21.9?

Line 12, (2): What is an approved entity? What is the process for approval?

Line 12, (2): As written, the "approved entities" <u>required</u> to request funds? Please explain the Board's authority to require an entity to request funds.

Line 12, (2): As the Board does not have "contact rule" (See Chapter 4 of the Administrative Rule Style Guide), is the entity required to send the written documents to a particular address or by a particular method?

Line 16, (2)(d): does your regulated public know what "itemized" is from the Board's perspective? This appears to be ambiguous as to what the Board is requiring.

The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this Rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this Rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the Rule will be approved. You may email the reviewing attorney to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

Generally, to the rule: This rule is poorly written. Lines 4-5 lead the reader to believe that definitions will follow; however, they appear to be requirements for each level of licensure.

Line 6, (a)(1): Replace "B.S." with "Bachelor of Science degree" for consistency with statute (G.S. 89C-13(b)(1a)a.)

Line 14-15, (a)(2): As written, "which must be completed with a passing grade" applies only to the courses after "including". Is that the Board's intention?

Lines 22-24, (3)(C): While line 17 addresses "programs", Part (C) does not appear to be program of study but rather 39 college semester hours. "Based upon" is ambiguous. Part (C) needs to be re-written in clear and concise terms.

Lines 25-30, (3)(C)(i): This Subpart is facially ambiguous. "Basic mathematics" and "higher mathematics" are undefined terms. How will the Board determine whether a course has "emphasized" "concepts and principals"?

Lines 25 and 31: Spell out the numbers beginning the Subparts.

Line 28, (3)(C)(i): Change "may" to "shall" or cite these as examples of "higher mathematics". In short, the Board needs to be clear and unambiguous about that which it is requiring. If an applicant needs to ask for clarification, there is ambiguity.

Line 30, (C)(i): Strike the "." and replace with "; and".

Line 32, (3) (C)(ii): How will an applicant know whether the Board considers the faculty "qualified"?

Line 32, (3)(C)(ii): Are these examples of "surveying courses" or "surveying science and surveying practice"? Either? Both?

Line 1, (3)(D): What is the process by which the Board will approve an apprenticeship program or determine that it is equivalent to Parts (A), (B), or (C)? Is there a rule which addresses this?

Line 8, (b)(1): If it meets the Board's intention, strike "such that" and replace with "a".

Lines 12-23, (b)(2): This subparagraph is facially ambiguous, and no objective standard is listed. Line 17 and 18 state that the approve the experience on a case-by-case basis "if it is satisfied". There is no explanation as to when the Board's satisfaction will be met.

Lines 21-23, (b)(2): Please see G.S. 93B-15.1.

Lines 31-36, (c)(1)(A): As written the Professional Land Surveyor is required to make the listed statements on the map. Is that the Board's intention? Or does the Board want an affidavit?

Line 7, (c)(2): Is the "exhibit" the same as the statements required by the PLS in (c)(1)(A)?

Line 17, History Note: It appears that G.S. 47-30 is a cross reference and not a source of authority. As such, it should not be in the history note.

21 NCAC 56 .0601 is amended as published in 37:04 NCR 342-348 as follows:

21 NCAC 56 .0601 REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSING

(a) Education. The terms used by the Board for the specific education requirements to be eligible to be licensed as a Professional Land Surveyor are defined as follows:

- (1) "B.S. in surveying or other equivalent curriculum." These degrees shall contain a minimum of 45 semester hours, or their quarter-hour equivalents. Of the 45 semester hours, a minimum of 12 semester hours of surveying fundamentals, 12 semester hours of applied surveying practice, and 12 semester hours of advanced or theoretical surveying courses are required. The remainder of the required surveying courses may be elective-type courses in any of the categories; and
- (2) "Associate degree in surveying technology." This degree shall contain a minimum of 20 semester hours, or quarter-hour equivalents. Courses shall be in surveying fundamentals, applied surveying practice and advanced or theoretical surveying courses, including courses in surveying practices, subdivision design and planning, surface drainage, and photogrammetry which must be completed with a passing grade.
- (3) "Land Surveyor Apprenticeship." The applicant shall have completed one of the following programs:
 - (A) Certified Survey Technician Program (CST) of the National Society of Surveyors (NSPS) levels I through IV.
 - (B) "Technologist" Certification Program of the American Society for Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing (ASPRS).
 - (C) Based upon the Surveying Education Standard of the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES) by obtaining college semester credit hours, as modified to require the following 39 college semester hours:
 - (i) 12 college semester hours in mathematics beyond basic mathematics, but the credits include college algebra or higher mathematics. These courses must emphasize mathematical concepts and principles rather than computation. Mathematics courses may include college algebra, trigonometry, analytic geometry, differential and integral calculus, linear algebra, numerical analysis, probability and statistics, and advanced calculus.
 - (ii) 27 college semester hours of surveying science and surveying practice. Courses shall be taught by qualified surveying faculty. Examples of surveying courses are basic surveying, route surveying, geodesy, geographic information systems, land development design and planning, global positioning systems, photogrammetry, mapping, legal principles of land surveying, boundary law, professional surveying and mapping, and remote sensing. Graduate-level surveying courses can be included to fulfill curricular requirements in this area.

1		(D) Apprenticeship program, approved by the Board, and administered through
2		ApprenticeshipNC, or equivalent, including elements equivalent to Parts (A), (B), or (C)
3		of this Subparagraph.
4	(b) Experience:	
5	(1)	Definition. As used in the North Carolina Engineering and Land Surveying Act, the term
6		"progressive practical experience" means that during the period of time in which an applicant made
7		a practical utilization of the knowledge of the principles of geometry and trigonometry in
8		determining the shape, boundaries, position, and extent of the earth's surface, such that continuous
9		improvement, growth, and development in the utilization of that knowledge have been shown. In
10		addition, the applicant shall show the continuous assumption of greater individual responsibility for
11		the work product over that period of time.
12	(2)	Required Experience. In evaluating the work experience required, the Board shall consider the total
13		experience record and the progressive nature of the record. Not less than half of the required land
14		surveying experience shall be of a professional grade and character, and shall be performed under
15		the responsible charge of a Professional Land Surveyor. If the work was not under the responsible
16		charge of a Professional Land Surveyor, the applicant shall submit a written explanation to the Board
17		explaining why the experience should be considered. The Board shall approve the experience on a
18		case-by-case basis if it is satisfied of the grade and character of the progressive experience.
19		Experience gained under the technical supervision of an unlicensed individual shall be considered
20		based upon the engineering education and experience credential of the unlicensed supervisor.
21		Experience gained in the armed services, typically while serving in an engineering or surveying
22		related group, shall be accepted only if substantially equivalent to that which would have been
23		gained in civilian work.
24	(3)	Other Experience. The applicant shall document the nature and details of the work done in the
25		following areas to evidence to the Board its equivalency to land surveying:
26		(A) construction layout;
27		(B) engineering surveying; or
28		(C) part-time surveying work.

7		in Section .1600 of this Chapter, and as described in G.S. 47-30. In addition, the exhibit shall contain
8		a statement that the field work, calculation, and mapping were performed by the applicant under the
9		supervision of a Professional Land Surveyor, attested to by that Professional Land Surveyor.
10	(3)	Requirements for Comity Applicant. The map submitted by an applicant under comity may be a
11		representative map of an actual survey of a project or work performed in the state of licensure that
12		is modified to meet the requirements in Subparagraph (c)(2) of this Rule and shall be evaluated in
13		accordance with the requirements applicable to the particular project as described in the Standards
14		of Practice for Land Surveying in North Carolina as set forth in Section .1600 of this Chapter, and
15		as described in G.S. 47-30.

Line 10: How many units may be earned by accomplishing which activity? For example, if an applicant is deemed to have actively participated in outreach activities pursuant to subparagraph (11), how will the number of units earned be determined?

Lines 11-26: How is the Board verifying completion of subparagraphs (1) through (11)?

Line 4, (a): Identify the Board's authority to name itself the "final authority"? Are the Board's decisions not subject to appeal to the Office of Administrative Hearings pursuant to Article 3 of Chapter 150B of the North Carolina General Statutes?

Line 12: The standard of a "reasonably estimated time" is unclear and ambiguous.

Lines 13 and 14 (e): As written, the licensee can determine in his/her discretion what credit is received. Was that the agency's intention?

Line 16, (f): Define "actively".

Line 17, (f): Add a comma after "society".

Line 17 and 18: What is an "accreditation visit"?

Line 19 and 21, (g): Either define or strike "active".

Line 20, (g): What is the process for determining whether "participation" "requires utilizing engineering or land surveying knowledge"? Upon what criteria is the decision being based?

Generally, to the rule: What is the process by which the Board will approve sponsors? By what criteria is the Board making its decision to approve or disapprove? Is the sole criteria whether a proposed sponsor enters into the Approved Sponsor agreement?

Line 7, (a), line 24, (6) and line 31, (c): If the Board is requiring the use of one of its forms, the required contents of which must be adopted pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act (APA). Please identify the rule. If the information required by the form has not been adopted, it should be included here.

Lines 10-30, (b): There needs to be additional language that Subparagraphs (1) through (8) are the sole terms of the agreement. Absent such limiting language, the Board could add terms to the agreement which would effectively be a standard not adopted pursuant to the APA.

Line 19, (4): What standard will the Board employ to determine whether an instructor is "qualified"?

21 NCAC 56 .1713 is amended as published in 37:04 NCR 342-348 as follows:

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21 NCAC 56 .1713 SPONSORS

- 4 (a) The Board shall may approve sponsors of Continuing Professional Competency (CPC) activities. The Board shall
- 5 may maintain a list of sponsors which have agreed to conduct programs in accordance with the standards of CPC
- 6 activities set forth in 21 NCAC 56. 1700. Such sponsors shall indicate their agreement with the requirements by
- 7 executing a Sponsor Agreement on a form provided by the Board. These sponsors shall be designated as "Approved
- 8 Sponsors" based upon approval by the Board of the sponsor application and payment of a one hundred fifty dollar
- 9 (\$150.00) application fee.
- 10 (b) By entering into an agreement with the Board to be designated as an "Approved Sponsor," the sponsor shall agree to:
 - (1) Allow persons designated by this Board to attend any or all courses, without fee or charge, for the purpose of determining that said course meets the standards of the Board;
 - (2) Allow persons designated by this Board to review course material for the purpose of determining that the course meets the standards of the Board;
 - (3) State in every brochure, publication or announcement concerning the course, the general content of the course and the specific knowledge or skill to be taught or addressed, as well as the credit to be earned in Professional Development Hours (PDH);
 - (4) Ensure that the instructors or presenters of the course or program are qualified to teach the subject matter;
 - (5) Provide persons completing the course with written documentation attesting to that person's attendance to the course, as well as the name of the course, the date and location held, the instructor's name and the number of PDHs earned;
 - (6) Provide attendees an evaluation form as provided by the Board that is to be collected and retained for audit by the Board;
 - (7) Have a visible, continuous and identifiable contact person who is charged with the administration of the sponsor's CPC program and who has the responsibility for assuring and demonstrating to the Board compliance with this Rule, as well as for any other organization working with the sponsor for the development, distribution or presentation of CPC courses or activities; and
 - (8) Retain for a period of three years a copy of the documentation required by this Paragraph.
- 31 (c) Sponsors shall renew annually on a form provided by the Board.
 - (d) Failure of an approved sponsor to comply with the terms of the CPC sponsor agreement is grounds for the Board to revoke, suspend or terminate the agreement, to remove the sponsor's name from the list of approved sponsors and to notify the public of such action. A sponsor that is given notice of revocation, suspension or termination may request an administrative hearing to be conducted as provided in 21 NCAC 56 .1400 Contested Cases.
