In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

Ensure compliance with defined words, primarily those found in 14B NCAC 03.0401. In many rules, you depart from the form of the term used in your definitions rule, either using a different term or different abbreviation. As an example, see "North Carolina Search and Rescue System" and reference being made to the "NC Search and Rescue Program" in 14B NCAC 03.0410. If a phrase, entity, person, or other word is defined or abbreviated, that definition or abbreviation must be used later, depending upon the definition or abbreviation's applicability.

All uses of "NC" or any other shortened phrase without an appropriate abbreviation being stated beforehand should be spelled out in its entirety on the first use. For example, 14B NCAC 03 .0402 (10) and (11) and 14B NCAC 03 .0404 "FEMA ICS and NIMS".

Please capitalize "state" when referring only to the State of North Carolina.

Change all instances of "must" to "shall."

Please change your effective dates, as February 1, 2023 is the earliest possible effective date for these rules.

Throughout these Rules, I believe you've incorrectly applied G.S. 150B-21.6. You do not need to incorporate other rules or statutes by reference. However, you do need to incorporate by reference federal laws or regulations, the FEMA documents referenced in some of your rules, and other sources of information that you're attempting to enforce through these rules. Please revisit your incorporations and any other location where you're referencing outside material and revise accordingly. Further, please remember that G.S. 150B-21.6 requires you to state where the material is available and at what cost.

Please retype the rule accordingly and resubmit it to our office at 1711 New Hope Church Road, Raleigh, North Carolina 27609.

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In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

In general, is this Rule necessary? We generally discourage the use of purpose or scope rules.

In (a), line 7, I believe "Department of Public Safety" should be possessive: "...the North Carolina Department of Public Safety<u>'s</u> Division of Emergency Management...."

In (b), what "other participants" are being referenced? Is this defined? Does this encompass all involved entities, such as "Contract Response Teams" or "Participating Agencies", or perhaps all persons or entities made parties pursuant to G.S. 166A-66(a)(9)?

In (b), line 9, is it necessary to say "North Carolina Division of Emergency Management"? Earlier you say the "North Carolina Department of Public Safety Division of Emergency Management."

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The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this Rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this Rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the Rule will be approved. You may email the reviewing attorney to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

All definitions should be formatted as "(Definition)" means (explanation). Please change all definitions to mirror the format for clarity.

Also, (3), (8), and (22) are terms defined in G.S. 166-65. To the extent that the definitions in the Rule differ from the statutory definitions, please explain whether you are expanding or narrowing the definition.

On line 4, I believe you meant to say "As used in this <u>Section</u>...."

In (1), what are "resources" and how do they "provide all applicable capability..."? "Resources" here seems to reference persons, while Article 1A, Part 2, Article 4, and Article 6 do not define "resources" but do use it in the context of things, rather than persons. Is this a reference to "System Resources" in item (28)?

In (1), "threats" in line 6 should be singular.

In (1), what does "has the potential to impact the State" mean? Who makes this determination?

In (2), you are using the term defined—"authority"—in the definition. Please rephrase.

In (2), what is "response authority"?

In (3), you do not need to incorporate the statute by reference here. Simply referencing it will suffice (i.e. delete everything between "which is adopted" and "pursuant to G.S. 150B-21.6").

In (3), you are again using the term defined—"contract response team"—in the definition. The definition here, when boiled down, basically says a contract response team is a contract response team with self sustaining logistical support that can

respond to disasters. The only unique term here is "self sustaining logistical support" which is undefined. Please revise.

The definition in (4) needs more specificity. Similarly to (1), what "resource" is being "shared"? Also, what is the "NC Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement"? Consider incorporating by reference.

In (5), line 19, who determines when the disaster "overwhelms" the resources of local and State authorities?

The definition of (7) has large portions which say how the ICS is used and give examples of an ICS, rather than actually saying what the ICS is. Please revise.

With respect to (7), in Rule .0404(1), you refer to "FEMA ICS", rather than just "ICS". Is this the same thing? Is ICS defined somewhere in FEMA's regulations? If so, I think an incorporation by reference here might be necessary.

In (7), line 23, you state that an ICS is "standardized." Are these FEMA standards? (See above). Also, what is a "standardized[,] on-scene emergency management construct"? What is a "construct" in this usage?

In (8), the definition of "Incident Support Team" is already done by statute, which is not referenced here. Please reference the statute.

In (8), line 32, the phrase "...assist local and <u>S</u>tate emergency management **in management**..." is redundant. Please revise.

In (9), what is a "County Emergency Management Coordinator"? Is this pursuant to G.S. 166A-19.15 or another statute?

In (9), line 36, when you say "specific geographic area" do you mean "county"?

In (10), lines 1-2, is "The North Carolina Emergency Management program" the same as the "State Emergency Management Program" established in G.S. 166A-19.10? Also, ensure this complies with (14)'s requests.

In (10), line 3, what are "incident management requirements"?

Similarly to above requests, in (11), does "resources" or "Resource" mean something beyond "System Resources" in (28)?

Also, in (11), line 5, what "resource typing definitions" are being referenced? What "definitions"? Consider revising the definition to include the second sentence's purpose within the definition itself and avoid non-definitional substance.

In (11), line 6, I believe "defines" should be singular.

In (12), what is the "North Carolina Search and Rescue **System**"? G.S. 166A-66 establishes the "North Carolina Search and Rescue Program" in Article 6. Is this a mistake or oversight? Correct the abbreviation and all references in later rules.

Also, the definition in (12) appears to include two mistakes: (1) the Committee is tasked to advise the Secretary, based on G.S. 166A-69(d) and does not mention the Division of Emergency Management; and (2) the "search and rescue system" should be the "North Carolina Search and Rescue Program", which needs to be accurately stated and as a proper noun.

Similarly, in (13), what is the "North Carolina Search and Rescue Technical Advisory Committee"? G.S. 166A-69 establishes the "North Carolina Search and Rescue Team Advisory Committee" in Article 6. Is this a mistake or oversight? Correct the abbreviation and all references in later rules.

In (14), what is the "North Carolina Emergency Management"? Does the agency mean the "Division of Emergency Management" as is found in G.S. 166A-19.3(4) and as is referenced in item (27) of this Rule? The proper name, especially when established by statute, should be used.

In (14), line 15, who determines whether an emergency "could occur"? What is the standard for whether an emergency "could occur".

In (15), is the "Assistant Director" different from the "Deputy Director" as is found in G.S. 166A-69? Why is different terminology used?

In (17), what are the "principles" and how do they "guid[e] government agencies"?

In (17), line 20, "provides" should be singular.

In (18), line 25, is it necessary to say "paid or unpaid"?

In (18), line 25, what are the parameters of acting as an "agent of" a sponsoring or participating agency?

In (18), line 26, I believe you need to add "of" between "or" and "the".

Also, ensure the correct abbreviations are used for the Division and Program, and the Sponsoring Agency and Participating Agency are used as they are defined in this Rule.

In (20), who makes the determination whether someone caused an event?

In (20), the sentence ends without an object. "The entity whose actions... caused an event requiring search and rescue resources"... to do what?

Also, rewrite "search and rescue system resources" to be more specific. Presumably, the Department is referencing both the "North Carolina Search and Rescue Program" and "System Resources" which are defined in this Rule and should be used as such.

In (21), does Chapter 132 (Public Records Act) come into play here?

In (21), line 32, it is not necessary to state "but not limited to" after using "include" or "including".

In (21), line 33, insert a comma after "recordings" and consider "obtained" rather than "gained" to more accurately reflect receipt of the information.

Also, in (21), line 33, is "search and rescue operation" defined?

In (21), line 34, the "authority having jurisdiction" was previously abbreviated. Please use the abbreviation.

In (22), line 35, again you're using the term being defined—"**specialty** rescue team" in the definition. Please revise.

In (22), line 35, I believe "provided" should be "provide".

In (23), lines 1-2, what is an "active response agreement"?

In (23) and in (24), ensure proper reference to the Search and Rescue System as abbreviated in (12).

In (24), lines 5-6, what is "North Carolina Emergency Management"?

In (24), what kind of "assistance" does the Department mean? System Resources?

In (25), what type of "document" does the Department mean? Is there anything specifically required to satisfy it as a "document"?

In (25), line 7, I think there is a verb missing between "document" and "under". Please revise.

In (25), line 9, what is "an established[,] comprehensive, all-hazards approach"? Is this an All-hazards Disaster Response Model as used in (1)?

In (26), ensure proper reference to (12) and (14).

In (27), lines 12 and 14, again you're using the term defined—"personnel"—in the definition for System Personnel.

In (28), similarly to (23), what is an "active response agreement"?

Also, in (28), ensure proper reference to (14).

In History Note: Authority, consider adding G.S. 166A-67 for contracting authority and G.S. 166A-69 for the Search and Rescue Team Advisory Committee.

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In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

Pursuant to 14B NCAC 03.0402 and above requests, all references to "NC SAR" should be "NC SAR Program".

All references to "NCEM" or "NC Emergency Management" should be double checked to make sure they comply with any changes made to 14B NCAC 03 .0402.

In all instances of "System resources" or "qualified resources", use the full, capitalized construction "System Resources", unless another construction of the phrase is being used outside the defined term in 14B NCAC 03 .0402(25).

In (a), line 5, "all-hazards response model" should be capitalized, assuming it is the same term used in 14B NCAC 03.0402(1).

In (a), lines 5-6, I do not understand the meaning of the sentence "System resources... missing person incidents." Please rephrase for clarity.

While I generally have no objections to relieving human suffering or protecting life, property, or the environment, it appears to me that the language of (a), lines 6-8 goes beyond the statutory boundaries of what a search and rescue team is intended to do. 166A-65(2a) defines a search and rescue team as one that "assist[s] in the removal of trapped victims during emergencies[.]" Is there statutory authority for search and rescue teams organized under Ch. 166A to go beyond this mission?

Additionally, in (a), line 8, the rule refers to an "actual or potential threat". How is this defined, and who determines what is and is not an actual or potential threat?

I think the language of (b) is unclear. As I understand it, the NC SAR System is comprised of teams that may be under local control (i.e. a local fire department). Are you saying in (b) that if NCEM deploys a local resource, NCEM controls that resource to the exclusion of the local government? I think this paragraph should be revised for clarity.

Does (c) conflict with (b)? The idea that a local resource may deploy under its own authority, and that participation in the NC SAR System does not limit or supersede that local authority seems to be at odds with the idea that NCEM will "maintain direction and control" of a resource that it deploys. I suggest revising to clarify when NCEM has control and when the local authority has control.

In (d), line 13, who at "the State" is deploying System Resources? Please revise.

In (d)(1), line 16, what are "qualified resources"?

In (d)(1), line 18, what is a "team"? Is a "team" a "resource" or "System Resource"?

In (d)(1), line 21, what does "activating system resources" mean? If this is akin to deployment, I thought the AHJ made that decision under this model. Please clarify.

In (d)(2), line 23, remove the (s) in "barrier(s)" and choose either the singular or plural.

In (d)(2), line 24, what is "local . . . coordinated mutual aid"?

For both (d)(1) and (2), who chooses between these methods? Further, are there guidelines for choosing one over the other? It is unclear what the triggering event for each is. Only subparagraph (2) partly identifies a triggering event – "State of Emergency".

In (e), line 28, where is the statutory authority for the LEMC to delegate his or her authority? It looks like the LEMC position is created by statute in G.S. 166A-19.15(b), and I don't see where that provision allows the LEMC to delegate authority. Not saying it isn't there, but I don't see it. Please specify.

In (e), line 30, use AHJ for "authority having jurisdiction."

All references to "NCEM" should be double checked to make sure they comply with any changes made to 14B NCAC 03.0402.

In all instances of "system resources" or "resources", use the full, capitalized construction "System Resources", unless another construction of the phrase is being used outside the defined term in 14B NCAC 03 .0402(25).

While the title refers to a "Contract Response Team" the first line of the rule broadens to "all search and rescue resources." Please clarify this apparent contradiction.

In (1), line 5-6, please state with specificity which FEMA ICS and NIMS standards you are incorporating by reference. Please note that G.S. 150B-21.6 requires you to state where these resources can be obtained and at what cost. Please revise.

On line 5, what is "NIMS"? Unless you've included it in the definitions rule, the full name of the organization should be stated when used the first time.

I am confused by (2). This seems to contradict earlier statements in Rule .0403 that local authorities may deploy under their own authority and that participation in the NC SAR System does not supersede that authority. Please clarify and revise the rule.

In (2), line 7, what "personnel" must a resource follow? For instance, would the NCEM spokesman be able to direct the activities of a search and rescue team? Please revise for clarity.

In (3), line 8, "actives" should be "activities".

What are you requiring in (5)? Does state and federal law not apply to a search and rescue team otherwise? Please consider removing or at the very least specifying what specific state and federal laws a team must follow.

In your History Note, please remove the reference to the National Incident Management System, 3<sup>rd</sup> Edition, as I do not believe it confers authority on the Department.

In (g), line 18, I believe you need "the" between "with" and "FEMA"

In (g), lines 18-19, where can this Guide be found and at what cost? Brian Liebman

In line 5, wouldn't a "negligent" disaster also be a "manmade" disaster? Do you mean "negligent or intentional"?

Similarly to 14B NCAC 03 .0402, what is the extent to which the Department makes determinations of fault or liability in considering a "responsible party"? What is the authority for such a determination? In the case of persons disputing such a determination and reimbursement, what are the avenues for adjudication?

Both (1) and (2) are written in the passive tense. Please consider revising in the active tense. I.e. who shall bill a responsible party for costs, and who shall payment be remitted to?

In (1), line 7, please delete or define "reasonable costs". While I understand this is a statutory term, a Rule cannot be ambiguous or unclear even if it is repeating a statutory term.

In (1), line 9, I believe the reference should be to G.S. 166<u>A</u>.

In (1), there's no need to incorporate the statute by reference. Simply referring to it is sufficient.

In lines 11 and 12, what is the effect of "of eligible costs"? I think this is just kind of misplaced in the sentence – suggest revision.

In (2), line 12, is the invoice to go out via Certified Mail, or the payment?

In (c), line 24, when does the "within 18 months of a new contract period" begin? The first day of the contractual performance?

In (c), line 26, how is the "specified date" determined for interested parties? Is there a rule specifying a "specific date" shall be included for interested parties when distributing the bid announcement? This also applies to (c)(2).

In (c), line 27, change "must" to "shall".

In (c)(4), line 33, what are the "agreed upon criteria"? How is this established or what statute or rule is this determination made pursuant to? Who agrees upon this criteria? What informs the regulated public of this review process?

In (c)(4), line 34, can the designee set the date referenced as well as the NCEM Director? The designee can establish the committee, but not the date they meet?

In (c)(6), line 1, how will the successful bidders be notified?

In (c)(6), line 1, who shall draft the agreements?

Additionally, in (c)(6), lines 1-2, avoid a comma splice and rewrite the subparagraph as "... notified and system agreements shall be drafted and executed..."

Further, what are "system agreements"?

In (c)(7), line 3, what "two agreements" shall be drafted, executed, and maintained?

In (c)(7), line 3, the rule states the agreement has to be with the "sponsoring agency". I thought these agreements were between the NCEM and the contract response team. Please clarify.

In (c)(7)(A), lines 5-6, the rule states that the agreement is with the "sponsoring agency", but then states that the agreement will outline the terms that the "resource" must follow. Aren't these two different entities? How can the sponsoring agency make an agreement to bind the resource?

In (c)(7)(A), line 6, what "conditions and activities" shall be included in the cooperative agreement? What are the requirements for this agreement?

In (c)(7)(A), line 6, change "must" to "shall".

In (c)(7)(A), line 9, is the "contract period" referenced the contract between NCEM and the contract response team? Or is it the period of the two agreements mentioned in line 3? Please clarify.

In (c)(7)(B), what are "program costs"?

In (c)(7)(B), line 11, the funds are to be "utilized by the sponsoring and/or participating agencies" for what purpose? Please specify in the rule, or reorganize the paragraph for clarity.

In (d)(3), what is a "qualified resource"?

In (d)(4), line 36, change "must" to "shall".

Does this mean those 12 members specified in (A)-(C) are meant to be part of the 32 referenced in (e)(1), or do they bring the total to 44? Please revise for clarity.

In (a)(2), the second sentence jumps between singular and plural usages. Use "he or she" and "an agent", rather than "they" and "agents", respectively.

In (a)(2), lines 8-9, is it within the authority delegated to the agency by the General Assembly to determine whether personnel is or is not an agent of the State as a matter of law?

In (a)(4), it is unnecessary to incorporate the statute by reference. Merely referring to the statute is sufficient.

Restructure (a)(4) to clarify what you're referencing with the citation to G.S. 166A-19.60. As it currently reads, the citation to the statute suggests "program activity" is defined in the statute, while "emergency management worker" is defined instead.

Consider "while participating in any program activity, personnel shall be considered emergency management workers as defined..."

In Item (a)(5)(B), 12 NCAC 09B .0111(1) is an incorrect reference. The Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission recently revised several of their rules, so please revisit and correct the reference.

In (a)(5)(B), line 19, add a comma following "misdemeanor". Also, remove the period after "150B-21.6" and insert a comma.

In (a)(5)(B), lines 21-22, what is the period of time you're attempting to outline here? It says no misdemeanors for "five years or the completion of any corrections supervision imposed by the courts, whichever is later." I don't understand what this means. Please revise and clarify.

In (a)(5)(D), lines 28-29, I'm not sure what the reference "for the purpose of participating in the search and rescue system" (incidentally, should this be "NC SAR"?) means. Are you saying that being untruthful in some contexts is OK?

In (a)(5)(E), line 30, add a comma after "convicted."

In (a)(5)(E), line 31, capitalize "rule."

In (a)(5)(F), line 32, what kind of conduct are you referring to? This is very broad and impermissibly vague. Please revise and state with specificity what conduct is unsuitable for a NC SAR member.

In (a)(5)(F), line 33, where is "moral turpitude" defined? Without a definition, this is impermissibly vague.

In both (a)(6)(A) and (B), include a comma after "qualifying event".

In (a)(6)(A), where can the Manual be accessed? Can it be accessed for free? Also, in (B), it is unnecessary to incorporate the Manual again.

In (a)(6)(B), line 5, does the agency mean "convicted" when stating "found guilty"?

In (a)(6)(C), line 9, change "they" to "he or she has".

In (a)(6)(C), line 10, what is meant by "against the individual"?

In (a)(6)(D), capitalize "sponsoring agency" and use the abbreviation "NCEM".

Also, replace "person's" with "system personnel's".

In (a)(6)(D), lines 13-14, the agency shall notify the Division of "arrests or criminal charges and final dispositions" of whom?

In (a)(6)(E), remove all parentheticals and replace them with "pursuant to" each statute.

In (b)(1), line 20, who shall equipment "be made available for inspection and inventory"? By whom?

What does (b)(2) mean? What "requirement" is referenced? Please revise.

In (b)(3), line 23, I think you mean "manufacturer's recommendations".

Also, what do you mean by "damage to state property"? Do you mean the state-owned and issued equipment?

In (b)(4), place a comma after "upon separation".

In (b)(4), to whom or where must the property be returned?

In (c), (e), and (f), where are the "Type I" and "Type II" teams outlined or created?

Also, the NC USAR course should be stated in its entirety when first used.

And what is the federal "Equivalent Course".

In (c)(3), insert an "a" before "qualified", or make "specialist" plural.

Also, what is a "typed urban search and rescue team"?

At the end of (d), (e), and (f), place a colon.

In (d)(1), line 1, what does "functionally equivalent" mean? Please define.

In (d)(1), lines 2-3, where is the Cache List found, and at what cost?

In (d)(2), line 6, define "state of readiness".

In (e)(1), state the full name of "NFPA", unless stated previously. Further, please state where these materials can be found and at what cost.

In the subparagraphs (e)(1) through (3), how is "training that meets or exceeds training requirements" met?

In (e)(2) and (3), it is not necessary to reincorporate the NFPA chapters, just a reference will suffice.

In (f)(1)(C), (2)(C), and (3)(C), do you mean one portable computer? Also, what is a "minimum" of cellular internet access?

In (f)(1)(D) (2)(D), and (3)(D), define or delete "suitable".

In (f)(1)(E), and (2)(E), "spotlight" should be plural.

In (f)(1)(F), (2)(F), and (3)(E), do you mean a map of the whole state, or the region the team is assigned to?

Also, in each provision, "hardcopy" should be separate words and made plural.

In (f)(1)(H), (2)(H), and (3)(G), insert an Oxford comma after "sledgehammer".

In (f)(1)(H), (K), and (L), are the "kit[s]" fully described here? If not, what else is required?

In (f)(1)(J), (2)(J), and (3)(I) are the boats and motors separate requirements? It would seem as though the agency is trying to require 4 boats and 6 motors, but a reading of the text "with not less than six outboard motors" could be interpreted as each boat must have six motors.

In (f)(1)(L), (2)(L), and (3)(K), remove the first comma and add a comma after "bleach solution,".

In (f)(1)(L), (2)(L), and (3)(K), how many sprayers, buckets, work boxes, and pumps are required?

In (f)(1)(L), (2)(L), and (3)(K), what kind of solutions are you requiring? What soap? What concentration of each?

In (f)(1)(N), "raft" should be plural.

In (f)(1)(O), (2)(O), and (3)(N), please define what a "clamshell kit" is, and revise the "kit per kit" language.

In (f)(1)(Q), (2)(Q), and (3)(P), how is the 30-minute setup requirement determined? Is it an objective or subjective standard? Also, "setup" should be two words.

Also, in (1)(Q), (2)(Q), and (3)(P), separate the shelter system from the sleeping kits, unless the shelter system is required to have 16 sleeping kits internally within it. This is worded poorly and causes ambiguity. Please revise.

In (1)(Q), (2)(Q), and (3)(P), "cots" should be singular.

Additionally, in (1)(Q), (2)(Q), and (3)(P) remove the "and" at the end of each.

In (f)(1)(S), (2)(S), and (3)(R), what are "whip or fill" systems? Also, make "system" plural.

In (g)(1), line 36, "Program" should be plural.

Brian Liebman Commission Counsel Date submitted to agency: 1/5/23 In (g)(3), add "on" after "training", and "a" after "than."

In (g)(3), is this training already required elsewhere for certification? If so, is the requirement here more stringent than that required elsewhere? Do you have statutory authority to require more or less training than the entity that otherwise certifies helicopter rescue technicians?

In (h)(1), what does "good working order" mean? Define or delete.

In (h)(2), similarly to above, what does "damage" and "unusual wear" mean?

In (i)(1), please state the full name of ASTM, and state where the resource can be found and at what cost.

In (i) and (k)(2)(C), remove the parenthetical.

In (i) and (k)(2)(I), what is in the "set" of rain gear, and, in (i)(2)(L), the "fire starting kit".

In (i)(2)(M), the second instance of "measure" should be "measuring".

In (i) and (k)(2)(O), what is a ICS 214 form?

At the end of (i)(3)(A), insert an "and".

In (i)(3)(B), is a "first aid kit" standardized? What should be in it?

In (j)(3)(F), "cord" should be plural.

In (j)(3)(I), I think "of" is necessary after "each".

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## REQUEST FOR CHANGES PURSUANT TO G.S. 150B-21.10

The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this Rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this Rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the Rule will be approved. You may email the reviewing attorney to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

All references to "NCEM", "NCEM Operations Chief", "NC Search and Rescue Program", and "NC SAR System" should be double checked to make sure they comply with any changes made to 14B NCAC 03.0402. Also, ensure the abbreviations are used, such as "NCEM Director".

In all instances of "system resources", "resources", "contract response team", "specialty rescue team", and "system personnel", use the full, capitalized construction, unless another construction of the phrase is being used outside the defined term in 14B NCAC 03 .0402(25).

Are (a)(1) and (a)(2) exhaustive lists of the records NCEM will require?

The phrasing of (a) or (a)(3) should be revised. How does one make "available for [auditing]... access to functional exercises..."?

In (b) and the items under it, the text could use a rewrite for clarity. For instance, (b) is in the passive tense and could be simplified. Similarly, (b)(1) and (2) are more verbose than necessary. Please revise and simplify.

In (b)(2), what does it mean to "address" a finding? What are you requiring?

In (b)(2), who makes the referral to the disciplinary committee? Revise in the active tense.

Also in (b)(2), who gets referred to the disciplinary committee? An individual? The entire team? The team's leader? Please specify.

In (b)(3), what is "malicious or willful misconduct"? Please define. Similarly, what is meant by "misrepresentation" or "fraud"? What do these terms mean in context of a search and rescue operation?

Brian Liebman Commission Counsel Date submitted to agency: 1/5/23 In (c), is it within the authority delegated to the agency by the General Assembly to create a disciplinary committee and impose sanctions upon participants in the NC SAR system? G.S. 166A-66(10) gives you the authority to "audit" for the purpose of ensuring compliance with State and federal guidelines, but I don't see the power to impose sanctions for misconduct.

Even assuming there is authority to impose sanctions, do you have statutory authority to place the disciplinary committee under the Search and Rescue Technical Advisory Committee? G.S. 166A-69 establishes the Technical Advisory Committee and limits its role to "advis[ing] the Secretary on the establishment" of the SAR program and to "evaluat[ing] and advis[ing] the Secretary of the need for additional contract response teams...." I don't see where they have the authority to hear and rule on disciplinary matters.

In (c)(1)(C), what are you referring to here? What programs? What is a technical advisory group?

In (c)(2), what is "misconduct" beyond "breach of program requirements"? These are listed as two distinct areas for review. Please define.

In (c)(2), is it within the authority delegated to the agency by the General Assembly to prevent parties from being represented by counsel at a disciplinary hearing?

In (c)(2)(B), please revise for clarity. Facts cannot be in violation of the Rules.

In (c)(2)(B), does "the rules of the NC Search and Rescue Program" mean these Rules? If so, please say so.

In (c)(2)(C), is "dismission" necessary? I know it is a word, but it seems like "dismissal" is more easily understood by the regulated public and has the same meaning.

In (c)(2)(C), does the Director have the authority to dismiss an individual from a team that is not under his or her jurisdiction? i.e. a contract team, or one under the jurisdiction of a local authority.
