Subject: Changes to 2018 Fire Code, Plumbing Code, and Residential Code

Hi David and Nathan,

I've been reviewing the rules submitted to RRC by the Building Code Council for this month, and I've discovered some interesting language in the session laws that prompted these changes. Specifically, I'm referring to these rules:

2018 NC Fire Code, Section D107.1 (SL 2021-121, s. 6.(c))
2018 NC Fire Code, Section D107.2 (SL 2021-183, s. 3.(c))
2018 NC Plumbing Code, Table 605.3 Water Service Pipe (SL 2021-121, s. 7.(b), (c), and (d)).
2018 NC Residential Code Table P2906.4 Water Service Pipe (SL 2021-121, s. 7.(b), (c), and (d)).

If you look at the relevant session laws, the BCC is directed to make specific amendments and then is instructed:

"Rules adopted pursuant to this section are not subject to Part 3 of Article 2A of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes. Rules adopted pursuant to this section shall become effective as provided in G.S. 150B-21.3(b1), as though 10 or more written objections had been received as provided in G.S. 150B-21.3(b2)."

Part 3 of Article 2A of Chapter 150B refers to the RRC review process, so the GA is directing that these rule changes are not subject to RRC review. On the other hand, G.S. 150B-21.3(b1) and (b2) are the APA's legislative review provisions. The GA is saying that RRC will not review these rule changes, but that the changes will become effective with a delayed effective date as if RRC had received 10 letters of objection. However, under (b1) and (b2), the exact effective date depends on what the legislature does after the rules are referred for review. If the legislature does nothing, they become effective on the 31st legislative day. If a bill specifically disapproving the rules is introduced, the rules would become effective on the earlier of the date the bill was voted down or the date the legislature adjourns without a vote on the bill.

So, because the Codifier of Rules is responsible for sending rules subject to legislative review to the legislature, I've copied her here. It's my understanding these rules will be included in the next package of rules sent to the legislature, where they may be reviewed following the start of the 2024 short session.

In light of the relevant SL language, I would suggest withdrawing these rules from RRC review, and resubmitting with the proper boxes on the Submission of Permanent Rule forms checked. Box 4 asks whether the Rule is exempt from RRC review and for the applicable authority. Box 5 asks whether the rule is automatically subject to legislative review and again for the applicable authority. That way, these will be properly classified by the Codifier's staff.

To be clear, we're continuing to review 2018 NC Fire Code Sections 510.4.2, 510.5, 510.5.4, and Chapter 80, as well as 2020 Electrical Code Article 100 Definitions. We're also still reviewing the temporary rule submitted, as the session laws there (2022-6 and 2022-46) do not contain the same operative language.

2018 NC Fire Code

Section D107.1 One-or two-family dwelling residential developments (220614 Item B-1)

D107.1 One- or two-family dwelling residential developments.

Developments of one- or two-family dwellings where the number of *dwelling units* exceeds $\frac{30}{100}$ shall be provided with two separate and *approved* fire apparatus access roads.

Exceptions:

1. 2018 NC Fire Code Section D107.2 Remoteness (220614 Item B-2)

D107.2 Remoteness. Where two fire apparatus access roads are required, they shall be placed a distance apart equal to not less than one-half of the length of the maximum overall diagonal dimension of the property or area to be served, measured in a straight line between accesses.

Exception: For developments where compliance is technically infeasible because of road connectivity limitations, real property dimensions or limitations, real property acquisition constraints, or environmental constraints, as determined by the property owner or developer, the *fire code official* shall either not require two fire apparatus access roads or allow for alterations that provide for fire apparatus access road remoteness to the maximum extent technically feasible.

Hi David and Nathan,

I've been reviewing the rules submitted to RRC by the Building Code Council for this month, and I've discovered some interesting language in the session laws that prompted these changes. Specifically, I'm referring to these rules:

2018 NC Fire Code, Section D107.1 (SL 2021-121, s. 6.(c))
2018 NC Fire Code, Section D107.2 (SL 2021-183, s. 3.(c))
2018 NC Plumbing Code, Table 605.3 Water Service Pipe (SL 2021-121, s. 7.(b), (c), and (d)).
2018 NC Residential Code Table P2906.4 Water Service Pipe (SL 2021-121, s. 7.(b), (c), and (d)).

If you look at the relevant session laws, the BCC is directed to make specific amendments and then is instructed:

"Rules adopted pursuant to this section are not subject to Part 3 of Article 2A of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes. Rules adopted pursuant to this section shall become effective as provided in G.S. 150B-21.3(b1), as though 10 or more written objections had been received as provided in G.S. 150B-21.3(b2)."

Part 3 of Article 2A of Chapter 150B refers to the RRC review process, so the GA is directing that these rule changes are not subject to RRC review. On the other hand, G.S. 150B-21.3(b1) and (b2) are the APA's legislative review provisions. The GA is saying that RRC will not review these rule changes, but that the changes will become effective with a delayed effective date as if RRC had received 10 letters of objection. However, under (b1) and (b2), the exact effective date depends on what the legislature does after the rules are referred for review. If the legislature does nothing, they become effective on the 31st legislative day. If a bill specifically disapproving the rules is introduced, the rules would become effective on the earlier of the date the bill was voted down or the date the legislature adjourns without a vote on the bill.

So, because the Codifier of Rules is responsible for sending rules subject to legislative review to the legislature, I've copied her here. It's my understanding these rules will be included in the next package of rules sent to the legislature, where they may be reviewed following the start of the 2024 short session.

In light of the relevant SL language, I would suggest withdrawing these rules from RRC review, and resubmitting with the proper boxes on the Submission of Permanent Rule forms checked. Box 4 asks whether the Rule is exempt from RRC review and for the applicable authority. Box 5 asks whether the rule is automatically subject to legislative review and again for the applicable authority. That way, these will be properly classified by the Codifier's staff.

To be clear, we're continuing to review 2018 NC Fire Code Sections 510.4.2, 510.5, 510.5.4, and Chapter 80, as well as 2020 Electrical Code Article 100 Definitions. We're also still reviewing the temporary rule submitted, as the session laws there (2022-6 and 2022-46) do not contain the same operative language.
