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21 NCAC 36 .0228 Clinical Nurse Specialist Practice is amended, with changes, as published in NCR 37:10, pages 2 757-759 as follows:

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#### 21 NCAC 36 .0228 CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST PRACTICE

- (a) Only a registered nurse who meets the qualifications outlined in Paragraph (b) of this Rule shall be approved by the Board as a clinical nurse specialist to perform advanced practice registered nursing activities listed in Paragraph (f) of this Rule.
- 8 (b) The Board shall approve an applicant who:
  - has an active, unencumbered license to practice as a registered nurse in North Carolina or a state (1) that has adopted the Nurse Licensure Compact;
  - (2) has an unrestricted previous approval, registration, or license as a clinical nurse specialist if previously approved, registered, or licensed as a clinical nurse specialist in another state, territory, or possession of the United States;
  - has successfully completed a master's or higher-level higher-level degree program that is accredited (3) by a nursing accrediting body approved by the United States Secretary of Education or the Council for Higher Education Accreditation and meets the qualifications for clinical nurse specialist certification by an approved national credentialing body under Part (b)(4)(A) Subparagraph (b)(4) of this Rule; and
  - (4) either:
    - (A)has current certification as a clinical nurse specialist from a national credentialing body approved by the Board, as defined in Paragraph (h) of this Rule and 21 NCAC 36 .0120(26); or 21 NCAC 36 [.0120(26).] .0120(33).
    - (B) meets requirements that are equivalent to national certification if no clinical nurse specialist certification is available in the specialty. The Board shall determine equivalence based on consideration of an official transcript and course descriptions validating Subparagraph (b)(3) of this Rule, a current curriculum vitae, work history, professional recommendations indicating evidence of at least 1,000 hours of clinical nurse specialist practice, and documentation of certificates indicating 75 contact hours of continuing education applicable to clinical nurse specialist practice during the previous five years.

Hi Angela and Meredith,

I've reviewed your changes, and I have a few follow ups for Rule .0228. Rule .0817 looks fine, and I'll recommend approval.

I've copied the relevant change requests and added my comments in bold.

### Rule .0228

In (b)(4), line 21, the reference to Rule .0120 needs to be corrected. The definition for "national credentialing body" is at (33) not (26).

Corrected.

Actually, it now says (36), when it needs to be (33).

In (c), the sentence is a bit of a run-on. Consider breaking it up or rephrasing in some way to eliminate the sequential "ands".

Removed "and" at the beginning of the sentence.

Looks like it is still there.

In (f), p.2, lines 6-7, what are "nursing principles at an advance practice registered nurse level"? Are these defined elsewhere?

Revised language to refer to the essential core competencies for professional nursing education, which addresses the APRN nursing principles and would be understood by the regulated public.

Fine, but please delete "an" prior to "advanced".

In (g)(1)(A), line 31, strike "either".

Corrected.

No, it's still there.

In (g)(3)(B), when you say "recognized in North Carolina" do you mean recognized by the Board? Yes. Revised to say "Board."

I think you deleted a verb accidentally. It now says "if by the Board as a clinical nurse specialist..."

In (g)(3)(B) and (C), I'm confused by the reference to "every 5 years" when the approval period is every 2 years. How would someone applying for re-approval after his or her first 2 year period satisfy this? It only has to be satisfied every 5 years, so it wouldn't apply to first-time applicants.

That really isn't clear from the text of the Rule. If you don't intend first time applicants to meet this requirement, I think you need to say so.

In (g)(4), I think you need to rephrase to let (4) flow as a sentence from the opening clause on p.2, line 28. As currently constructed, it says "A registered nurse seeking approval by the Board as a clinical nurse specialist shall: . . . . Documentation shall be maintained..." Consider deleting "and" at the end of (g)(2) on p.2, line 35, adding an "and" at the end of (g)(3)(C), on p.3, line 10, and amending (g)(4) to say something along the lines of "maintain documentation for the previous five years..."

Revised.

Thank you, but please put "maintain" in lowercase.

I am confused by (h). The Rule states that the Board shall approve a national credentialing body, which I assume is not a person, but an organization. Yet, (1) and (2) speak of licensure, certification, and education requirements that appear to be aimed at an individual. Are you asking for the body to have staff that comply with these requirements? Please clarify and revise the Rule accordingly. (h) sets the minimum requirements for the Board to approve a national credentialing body. It reinforces that the national credentialing body must verify these two requirements in order for them to be approved by the Board.

I hate to say it but I am now even more confused. Who is them? The national credentialing body? Or the applicants to the national credentialing body? I'm assuming it's the latter, but that is unclear from the language. If that's it, I would suggest saying "...established the following minimum requirements for applicants:"
