REQUEST FOR CHANGES PURSUANT TO G.S. 150B-21.10

The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this Rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this Rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the Rule will be approved. You may email the reviewing attorney to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

In (b)(3), line 16, does the phrase "meets the qualifications for clinical nurse specialist certification..." apply to the applicant, or to the degree program? I'm assuming it's the latter, but wanted to be clear, because if it does apply to the applicant, I think it'd best be combined with current (b)(4) below.

In (b)(4), line 21, the reference to Rule .0120 needs to be corrected. The definition for "national credentialing body" is at (33) not (26).

In (c), the sentence is a bit of a run-on. Consider breaking it up or rephrasing in some way to eliminate the sequential "ands".

Same with (d), it's a bit of a long run on sentence. Maybe break it up into a list?

In (e), line 36, I'm a little unclear how one could be a clinical nurse specialist, but not practice and not have Board approval? Do you mean someone who is already recognized as a clinical nurse specialist by a national credentialing body?

In (f), p.2, lines 6-7, what are "nursing principles at an advance practice registered nurse level"? Are these defined elsewhere?

In (f)(2) and (3), lines 11-14, what is an "advanced practice nursing framework"?

In (f)(10), what are you requiring your regulated public to do? This sounds a bit more like an aspirational goal than a rule.

In (g)(1)(A), line 30, what is the "appropriate application"? Are the contents of that application fully set out in this, or another Rule?

In (g)(1)(A), line 30, consider putting the educational requirements into a list set off with commas, such as: "evidence of a master's <u>degree</u>, doctoral degree, or a post-<u>master's certificate</u>, as set out..."

Brian Liebman Commission Counsel Date submitted to agency: March 1, 2023 In (g)(1)(A), line 31, strike "either".

In (g)(3)(B), when you say "recognized in North Carolina" do you mean recognized by the Board?

In (g)(3)(B) and (C), I'm confused by the reference to "every 5 years" when the approval period is every 2 years. How would someone applying for re-approval after his or her first 2 year period satisfy this?

Also, does the "every 5 years" period apply to both the 1000 hours of practice and the 75 contact hours of CE?

In (g)(4), I think you need to rephrase to let (4) flow as a sentence from the opening clause on p.2, line 28. As currently constructed, it says "A registered nurse seeking approval by the Board as a clinical nurse specialist shall: Documentation shall be maintained..." Consider deleting "and" at the end of (g)(2) on p.2, line 35, adding an "and" at the end of (g)(3)(C), on p.3, line 10, and amending (g)(4) to say something along the lines of "maintain documentation for the previous five years..."

In (g)(4), line 11, what documentation are you requiring the CNS to maintain? Please clarify and revise the Rule accordingly.

I am confused by (h). The Rule states that the Board shall approve a national credentialing body, which I assume is not a person, but an organization. Yet, (1) and (2) speak of licensure, certification, and education requirements that appear to be aimed at an individual. Are you asking for the body to have staff that comply with these requirements? Please clarify and revise the Rule accordingly.

In your History Note, why do you cite to G.S. 90-171.27? This has to do with fees, and I don't see any required in this Rule.
