Chris, thanks for your notes and attention on all these issues. Below, I'm going to copy each segment of your message, then give my response.

- **Withdrawal of 06 NCAC 01 .0109:** Thanks for your response on this rule. Because this rule is being withdrawn by the Council, it will not be posted for RRC review at the June 25th meeting. But we will make note of the withdrawal on the meeting agenda and in my comments at the meeting.

Thanks; that will work well.

- **Formatting Changes for All Rules:** Because these rules are now *adoptions with changes from publication*, changes do not need to be denoted with highlighting. Rather, any text to be deleted shall be struck through and new text shall be underlined. The unchanged text shall not be underlined. I have made these formatting changes for all 12 attached rules. Please use these versions going forward.

Thanks. Here are two very technical questions in response, so that I can (hopefully) do the formatting correctly next time. First, so that I'm rooted in the right section of the rules, the relevant formatting rule here is 26 NCAC 02C .0405(b)(1), right? **Yes, that is the correct rule.** Second, could you help me understand the situation where the formatting rules in 26 NCAC 02C .0405(b)(2) would apply? **(b)(2) would apply to rule amendments for the Code (rather than rule adoptions). So, if the agency made changes to proposed rule amendments after the initial publication (either because the agency made additional changes on their own or they made them in response to RRC Staff feedback), then those would**

be subject to the additional highlighting and bracketing requirements. We have better guidance on this on our website, so if you ever have questions, look to: <https://www.oah.nc.gov/rule-format-examples>.

- **Effective Dates for All Rules:** For rules 01 .0108, 01 .0110, 01 .0114, .02 .0105, and .04 .0104, I updated the effective dates from May 1 to July 1.

Thank you; that's great.

- **06 NCAC 04 .0103:**
 - On lines 8-9, the rule states, "Such persons may also request either type of declaratory ruling concerning the statute under which the rule was adopted." What exactly does this mean? Are you saying that a person can make a request for the Council to determine whether a *statute* is valid? I'm not sure that aligns with the language of G.S. 150B-4.

I see your point. It would be better for that sentence on lines 8-9 to read, "Such persons may also request a declaratory ruling concerning the applicability to a given factual situation of a statute administered by the Council." **The edits look good to me.**

- In the added text on lines 15-18, the language you use seems to focus primarily on *proposed* rules. However, can't these declaratory ruling requests also relate to the application of *existing* rules? Consider revising this language to include both situations.

Yes, a request for declaratory ruling could relate to an existing rule. As a result, it would be clearer if "proposed" was removed in the phrase "proposed rule." **The edits look good to me.**

I've attached a version of rule 06 NCAC 04 .0103 with these changes made. (It remains formatted as an adoption with changes from publication, which I hope is correct.)

Of course, I can't convene the Council of State to consider either of these changes. What is the best mechanism for resolving this point in these circumstances? The next meeting will likely be on July 7, 2026. **Given the time constraints, I think the only option is to move forward with v2 (attached) for Thursday's meeting. And given that v2 is missing these last changes, I think I'll have to object to the rule on the basis of clarity and statutory authority issues. Assuming the Commission agrees, you'd then have 30 days from Thursday to address that objection and get sign off from the Council on these final changes (hopefully giving you enough time). 06 NCAC 04 .0103 would then be re-reviewed at the July RRC Meeting. This is all assuming that there's no way for you to get v3 in front of the Council and approved prior to Thursday's meeting.**

In addition to making any new rule edits, please carefully review the attached versions of the rules for any discrepancies.

I've reviewed all the versions that you attached and found no discrepancies. Thanks again for taking the time to correct the formatting.

Thanks for taking my phone call earlier today. As I forecast on the call, the Council of State requests an extension of the period to review its proposed rules until the Rules Review Commission meeting on June 25, 2026. This would extend the Council of State's time to respond to the Request for Technical Changes until June 12, 2026.

An extension is necessary in order to give the members of the Council of State time to meet, discuss, and take action on the proposed rules in response to Rules Review Commission feedback. The proposed rules would be on the agenda for the May or June Council of State meetings.

An extension until the June RRC meeting avoids a very difficult scheduling interaction if the proposed rules were taken for approval to the May RRC meeting and the RRC members raised an objection. After the May 28 RRC meeting, the next monthly Council of State meeting will take place on June 2. That would require placing on the Council of State agenda, with only two business days' notice, any rule changes resulting from RRC objections. Hearing the Council of State rules at the June 25 RRC meeting allows more time between the RRC meeting and the next Council of State meeting, currently scheduled for July 7.
