Doug,

I have reviewed the form, the response, and the technical changes proposed. I really appreciate your responsiveness to my questions and suggestions. I have actually noted a more significant concern that I need you to address as well as a couple small clean up items.

1. Authority- In taking a deeper dive into the Authority for this rule I noted serious concerns. G.S. 90-334 gives The Board significant authority including rule making power however it appears to be limited to "this Article" meaning Article 24. For example, (a) The Board shall administer and enforce the **provisions of this Article**; (c) The Board shall examine and pass on the qualifications of all applicants for licenses **under this Article**; (h) Subject to the provisions of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, the Board shall have the power to adopt, amend, or repeal rules to carry out the purposes **of this Article**.... Nothing in Article 24 was amended to include Article 24A in The Board's authority. In contrast SL 2022-52 set up a "new" Article, Article 24A. I could not find anything in 24A that ties it back to 24 for Authority to The Board. Instead, 24A focuses its rulemaking authority to The Commission in GS 90-349.11, the interstate Commission being formed by the Compact. Clearly, the Compact requires the states to take actions, GS 90-349.3 clearly states that "a member state must currently do all of the following: (1) License and regulate licensed professional counselors" however I have not been able to locate where the General Assembly has granted any rule making power to The Board under 24A for that purpose. As The Board is more familiar with the ins and outs of the Compact can you please provide me with The Board's authority to adopt this rule either under 24 or 24A?

If we can establish the rule making Authority, there are only two other smaller items I noted in the Rule:

2. (a)(17) Page 2, Line 5 the word "and" is located between form and authorizing. I think it may have inadvertently migrated from Line 7 where it used to come after the semicolon. It needs to move back to line 5 and be struck through along with investigation and the semicolon ~~investigation; and~~
3. (a)(17) The Forms. I looked at the website address you noted for the forms. The forms listed on the website look to be the forms required for applicants out of state. Are applicants in state required to use the Live Scan system or is it just preferred? The Rule references only the Live Scan forms, if they are the only forms listed in the rule, they will be a requirement. The Live Scan forms are not available on the website. Based on the website they seem to be in an application portal, but I can't access that. Are they the same forms listed on the website, just located in the portal? If so, those are not forms created or controlled by the Board of Licensed Clinical Mental Health Counselors rather they are required by the FBI and SBI for agencies to request background checks and those agencies control what information is required. In that case you do not need to list the contents in the rule. You just need to name the agency and form. For example for the forms on the website you could say, "(17) A signed Federal Bureau of Investigation form

FD-258 and a signed North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation form Authority for Release for Criminal Background Check."

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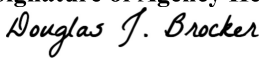

21 NCAC 53 .0312 is adopted with changes as published in 40:20 NCR 1621-22 as follows:

**21 NCAC 53 .0312 LICENSURE BY VIRTUE OF PRIVILEGE AND CHANGE OF RESIDENCY
UNDER PROFESSIONAL COUNSELING LICENSURE COMPACT**

(a) The terminology used in this Rule conforms to the definitions set forth in G.S. 90-349.2. In accordance with G.S. 90-349.15, Rules .0205, .0206, and .0304 of this Chapter shall not apply to applicants under this Rule. Pursuant to G.S. 90-349.5, and notwithstanding the requirements of Rules .0205, .0206, and .0304 of this Chapter, an individual licensed by another member state of the Professional Counseling Licensure Compact, and who holds ~~an active~~ a privilege to practice in this State, may apply for licensure as a Licensed Clinical Mental Health Counselor by virtue of the privilege if North Carolina has become the individual's ~~primary residence~~ home state. The privilege holder seeking licensure based on change of ~~primary residence~~ home state shall submit an application on the form furnished by the Board at www.ncblcmhc.org. The ~~following application form shall contain the following information and documentation:~~ documentation must be provided with the application form:

- (1) ~~Complete~~ Full legal name;
- (2) Date of birth;
- (3) Social Security Number;
- (4) National Practitioner Identifier;
- (5) Any other name by which the applicant was known in the past, accompanied by a certified copy of a court order of name change, if applicable;
- (6) Home phone number;
- (7) Work phone number;
- (8) Cell phone number;
- (9) Email address;
- (10) Primary residential address, dates of residency at that address, and any other primary residential addresses in the 12 consecutive months prior to submitting the application;
- (11) Proof of applicant's primary residency in North Carolina, including any of the following documentation for the applicant:
 - (A) ___ filed North Carolina state income tax return for the most recent year;
 - (B) ___ deed demonstrating ownership of property in North Carolina where the applicant resides;
 - (C) ___ unexpired North Carolina driver's license;
 - (D) ___ active registration to vote in North Carolina; or
 - (E) ___ active registration in North Carolina of a vehicle owned by applicant;
- (12) Identification of current home state, home state license number, current license status, any prior disciplinary or administrative action, and expiration date of home state license;
- (13) North Carolina privilege number;
- (14) A statement regarding any existing or prior encumbrance or restriction on any state-issued license or privilege and the dates of such encumbrance or restriction;

- 1 (15) A statement regarding any adverse action, including disciplinary action, taken against the
2 applicant's license or privilege in any state;
- 3 (16) The applicant's Professional Disclosure Statement meeting the requirements of Rule .0204 of this
4 Chapter;
- 5 (17) A ~~completed fingerprint record card and~~ signed release of information form and authorizing the
6 Board to request and receive a fingerprint-based criminal history record check from the Federal
7 Bureau of Investigation and the North Carolina State Bureau of ~~Investigation~~; Investigation. The
8 form shall set forth the applicant's legal name, social security number, date of birth, gender and
9 race. The applicant shall also complete a Live Scan fingerprint application for obtaining fingerprints
10 used to conduct the criminal background check. The form shall set forth the applicant's name, date
11 of birth, residential address, aliases, sex, race, height, weight, eye color and hair color. The release
12 of information form and Live Scan fingerprint application form are available on the Board's website,
13 <https://ncblcmhc.org/Licensure/Applying/CBC>; and
- 14 (18) Documentation of successful completion of the jurisprudence exam published on the Board's
15 website, completed within six months prior to seeking licensure.
- 16 (b) Pursuant to G.S. 90-349.5(b), the applicant for licensure ~~must~~ shall pay the application fee set forth in Rule .0501
17 of this Chapter.
- 18 (c) Once a privilege is converted to a home state license, applicant shall notify their former home state that North
19 Carolina is their new home state under the Compact.
