1		(m) the dated signature of individuals identified in Paragraph 1(b) and 1(c) of this Rule; and
2		(n) the dated signature of the local health department representative.
3	(2)	Prepare a signed and sealed statement of special inspections as set forth in G.S. 130A-336.2; that
4		includes the following items:
5		(a) The materials, systems, components, and work subject to special inspections and testing;
6		(b) The type, frequency, and extent of each special inspection and each test;
7	(3)	Notify the owner if the system constitutes a water pollution control system, as defined by 15A
8		NCAC 08G .0102(31), for which will require the owner is required to enter into a contract with a
9		water pollution control system operator certified pursuant to Part 1 of Article 3 of Chapter 90A of
10		the General Statutes; and
11	(4)	Maintain a signed and dated copy of the operation and management program that was provided to
12		the system owner and all inspection reports records for a period of seven years. This shall include a
13		signed and dated copy of the operation and management program that was provided to the system
14		owner and all inspection reports.
