Pursuant to 26 NCAC 05 .0112: WAIVER, I am requesting a waiver to allow for additional public comments beyond the timeframe allowed under 26 NCAC 05 for the reasons as noted below.

- (d) The factors to be used in deciding whether to waive a rule are:
  - the necessity for a waiver;
     The last-minute response by the agency's rulemaking coordinator did not leave time to respond to his comments.
  - the amount of notice given to the Commission and its staff, the agency proposing the rule, and interested parties;
     The last-minute response by the agency's rulemaking coordinator did not provide adequate time for additional public.
  - (3) the applicant's responsibility for the conditions creating the need for a waiver;I was not aware of the agency's comments until after the deadline.
  - (4) the applicant's previous requests for a waiver; None
  - (5) the applicant's knowledge of or experience with the rulemaking process;
     Minimal working knowledge of or experience with the RRC process, I am generally familiar with the rulemaking process.
  - (6) the precedential value of such a waiver;The waiver will allow the commission to hear additional public comments.

- (7) the harm to the applicant if a waiver is not granted;The commission will not be able to consider my comments.
- (8) the harm to the agency if a waiver is granted when the agency is not the applicant. None, the RRC will consider all agency comments in addition to all public comments and will render its decision accordingly.
