Good afternoon –

Thank you for your questions based on your review of the 2024 State Medical Facilities Plan.

The following laws are applicable to your questions regarding the Plan's approval versus its adoption.

Pursuant to G.S. § 150B-2(2) "adopt" means "[t]o take final action to create, amend or repeal a rule." G.S. §150B-2 (8a)k. defines a rule as "[a]ny agency regulation, standard, or statement of general applicability that implements or interprets an enactment of the General Assembly or Congress or a regulation adopted by a federal agency or that describes the procedure or practice requirements of an agency. The term includes the establishment of a fee and the amendment or repeal of a prior rule. The term does not include the following:

...

k. The State Medical Facilities Plan, if the Plan has been prepared with public notice and hearing as provided in G.S. 131E-176(25), reviewed by the Commission for compliance with G.S. 131E-176(25), and *approved* by the Governor. (Emphasis Added.)

Additionally, G.S. §131E-176(25), in Article 9 of Chapter 131E (the Certificate of Need Law) defines the State Medical Facilities Plan as "[t]he plan prepared by the Department of Health and Human Services and the North Carolina State Health Coordinating Council, and approved by the Governor. In preparing the Plan, the Department and the State Health Coordinating Council shall maintain a mailing list of persons who have requested notice of public hearings regarding the Plan. Not less than 15 days prior to a scheduled public hearing, the Department shall notify persons on its mailing list of the date, time, and location of the hearing. The Department shall hold at least one public hearing prior to the adoption of the proposed Plan and at least six public hearings after the adoption of the proposed Plan by the State Health Coordinating Council. The Council shall accept oral and written comments from the public concerning the Plan." The word "adopt" is not defined in Article 9 of Chapter 131E. However, the Oxford Learner's Dictionary defines the word "adopt" as follows: "[to]... formally accept a suggestion or policy by voting." <u>Oxford Learners</u> <u>Dictionary</u>

The State Medical Facilities Plan is not a rule within the mea§150B-2 (8a)k. Therefore, the State Medical Facilities Plan does not require adoption in accordance with G.S. § 150B-2(2). Although G.S. 131E-176(25) references the adoption of the proposed and final Plans, neither the term "adopt" nor "adoption" is defined anywhere in Article 9 of Chapter 131E. Conversely, the State Medical Facilities Plan is annually prepared by the State Health Coordinating Council, with support from the agency, in accordance with G.S. 131E-176(25) and then *approved* by the Governor.

Accordingly, our responses to your questions are shared below in bold text.

On pgs. 74-76 of the Notebook, it appears that a proposed plan was approved on May 31, 2023. When was the proposed plan adopted by the State Health Coordinating Council? The State Health Coordinating Council, by its vote of approval, adopted the Proposed 2024 State Medical Facilities Plan (the "Plan") on May 31, 2023.

On pgs. 77-79 of the Notebook, it appears that the final plan was approved on October 4, 2023. When was the final plan adopted by the State Health Coordinating Council? The State Health Coordinating Council, by its vote of approval, adopted the 2024 State Medical Facilities Plan on October 4, 2023.

The November 29, 2023, memo submitted to Commission Counsel indicates the governor had not yet approved the plan at that time. The plan was publicly posted and appears to have the governor's approval. When did the governor approve the plan? Please submit the Governor's approval to us, including the date. The Governor approved the 2024 State Medical Facilities Plan on December 22, 2023. (See attached memorandum and approval documents)
