3 15A NCAC 10A .1201 EMERGENCY POWERS

4 (a) Upon a finding determination by the Wildlife Resources Commission [determining] that a wildlife disease

5 threatens irreparable injury to wildlife or to the public, the Executive Director shall develop an emergency response

6 plan in consultation with the Commission, Governor's office and the State Veterinarian. The plan may prescribe

- 7 <u>Veterinarian prescribing</u> one or more of the following actions:
- 8 (1) shorten or lengthen harvest seasons;
- 9 (2) prohibit transport of wildlife resources or parts thereof;
- 10 (3) prohibit possession of wildlife resources;
- 11 (4) confiscate wildlife resources;
- 12 (5) revoke licenses or permits;
- 13 (6) expand or restrict daily bag limits, daily creel limits, and possession limits;
- 14 (7) establish mandatory wildlife check stations;
- 15 (8) restrict public access to game lands;
- (9) require prepayment of outside testing costs by persons who desire disease testing of their harvested
 wildlife resource when such testing is not essential to the objectives of the plan;
- 18 (10) prohibit supplemental feeding or baiting of wildlife;
- (11) prohibit any other activities that aid in the transmission or movement of the disease as determined
 by the best available science regarding the disease threat;
- 21 (12) implement any other activities necessary to reduce infection opportunities; and

22 (13) implement any other requirements necessary to assist in the detection and isolation of the disease.

(b) The Commission shall inform the public of the <u>implementation of emergency powers and</u> actions in the response plan through press releases, postings on the Wildlife Commission web site, <u>website and social media</u>, letters emails sent to representatives of sportsmen's groups or other constituents likely to be directly affected, and by employee outreach.

The Commission has not yet reviewed this Rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the Rule will be approved. In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

G.S. 113-306(f) provides that the "Commission may adopt rules governing the exercise of emergency powers by the Executive Director when the Commission determines that such powers are necessary to respond to a wildlife disease that threatens irreparable injury to wildlife or the public." It appears that a determination by the Commission is necessary before the Executive Director can exercise emergency powers under the statute. The edits to the rule appear to eliminate the Commission's determination from this process. Is this intentional? And if so, how does this not contradict the statute?

If this was unintentional, it appears that undoing the changes to line 4 would solve the problem. Or consider on line 4 something like: "Upon a determination by the Commission that a wildlife disease..."

G.S. 113-306(f) requires that: "The rules shall provide that the Executive Director must consult with the Commission, the State Veterinarian, and the Governor prior to implementing the emergency powers." On lines 5 and 6, the rule only provides that the Director consult with the Governor and the State Veterinarian. How does this meet the statutory requirements?

To address the prior comment, consider on line 6: "with <u>the Commission</u>, the Governor's office and..."

In the history note on line 29, "March 1, 2011" is the effective date, and "November 1, 2023" should be the amended effective date. This should be formatted like you have in the other rules.
