



15 all other trails posted for equestrian use, horseback riding is allowed seven days per week from May
16 16 through August 31, and on Sundays only from September 1 through May15. People age 16 or
17 older shall obtain a game land license prior to engaging in horseback riding on any area other than
18 the American Tobacco Trail.

19 (4) Target shooting is prohibited.

20 (5) Wild turkey hunting is by permit only, except on those areas posted as an Archery Zone.

21 (6) The use of bicycles is restricted to designated areas, except that this restriction does not apply to
