Please see my comments-questions below:

In (a)(3), your agency's use of the word "permanent" is unclear to me. How can fish be permanently possessed? A fish is permanently possessed when the angler decides not to throw it back. Just because you catch a fish and throw it in your live well doesn't mean you're going to take it home with you, but it is possessed. You may continue fishing and end up catching a bigger fish. At that point, you may decide to throw the first fish back and keep the bigger one. Alternatively, you may not catch any other fish that day and decide when you start packing up for the day, that you don't want to go through the trouble of cleaning one fish and throw the fish back at that point. So, our definition of harvest accounts for those situations. Permanent possession is when you decide that you're done fishing and are keeping the fish.

I understand your explanation and the purpose behind using "permanent". I think your agency needs to define "permanent possession" in the Rule, as you've done here (when an individual stops fishing and decides to keep the fish). I suggest your agency insert "or taking" after "catching" to make your definition of "harvest" consistent with Marine Fisheries. I asked Marine Fisheries who will have "possession" of the fish once they're reduced since a vessel may include a captain, first mate, deckhands, or anglers that may all be involved in catching fish. I suggest using "permanent personal possession" in the definition of "harvest" or specify who will have possession when defining "permanent possession" in the Rule (e.g. "when an angler stops fishing and decides to keep the fish"). Who reduces the fish to permanent possession is important to determine for compliance with 15A NCAC 03I .0124(b).

In (c) lines 22-23, the language, "by midnight the day after harvest is complete", does not consider the exception Marine Fisheries is proposing in 15A NCAC 03I .0124(b), lines 13-15. It seems you will need to add the exception language to your Rule or cite the Marine Fisheries Rule for clarity. We do not think the exception cited in the Marine Fisheries Rule is necessary, as any electronic reporting method developed will work any day of the week and anglers are likely to plan if the expectation is clear.

I understand why your agency thinks the exception is unnecessary for electron reporting. However, uniformity in these Rules is important for clarity to the regulated public, especially when multiple agencies have concurrent jurisdiction. G.S. 113-170.3(d) says harvests shall be reported "in a manner consistent with rules adopted by the Marine Fisheries Commission and the Wildlife Resources Commission." It seems the S.L. directed the agencies to promulgate rules consistently in this circumstance.

The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this Rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this Rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the Rule will be approved. You may email the reviewing attorney to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

In (a)(1) line 5, please spell out "N.C.". Done.

In (3), your agency's definition of "harvest" is different than the definition adopted by Marine Fisheries in 15A NCAC 03I .0123. Is it important for both agencies to have the exact same definition in this situation? Staff from both agencies have attempted to reconcile definitions. We believe our definition allows for Wildlife Officer discretion, flexibility for anglers, and will accomplish desired compliance.

In (b), please add a comma after "species" (line 12) and after "waters" (line 13). Done.

In (c) lines 22-23, replace "by midnight the day after harvest is complete" with "in accordance with 15A NCAC 03I .0124(b)." We decided against referencing 03I .0124(b) because of the complexity of that paragraph. Our language is an attempt to make this rule enforceable and simple for the public.

In (e), your agency and Marine Fisheries should consider both using "are effective" or "shall be effective" in these rules for consistency. Ok.
